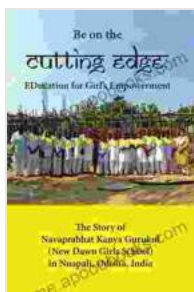

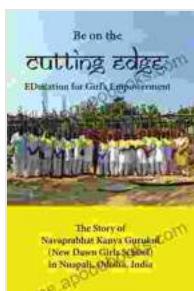
Overcoming the Barriers
