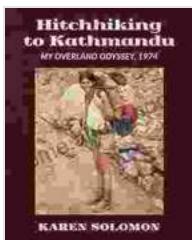


Hitchhiking to Kathmandu: My Overland Odyssey in 1974

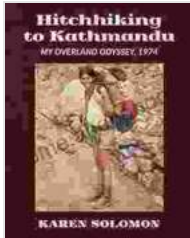

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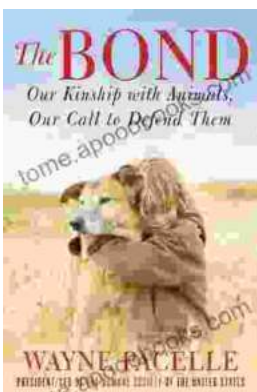


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
